Debriefing real-world clinical events is different than debriefing simulated events. The spontaneity, non-scripted nature of actual clinical events requires debriefers to be cognizant of the continuing duties of those involved, rapidly prioritize the issues to be discussed, and address legal and confidentiality matters. Discussion of such key issues is accompanied by multiple opportunities for participants to conduct debriefings and receive expert feedback from CAPE faculty on delivering constructive, objective and concise debriefings in the real clinical setting.
